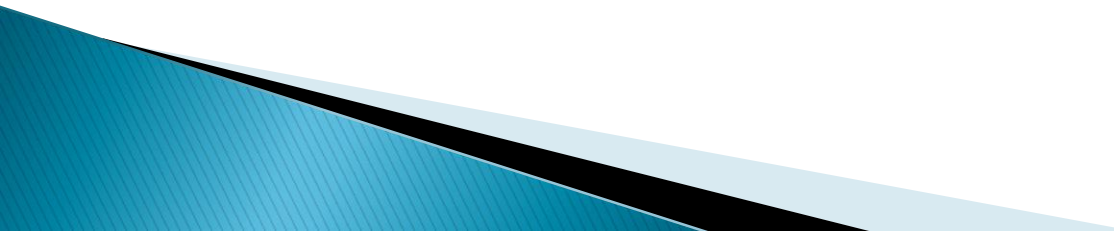


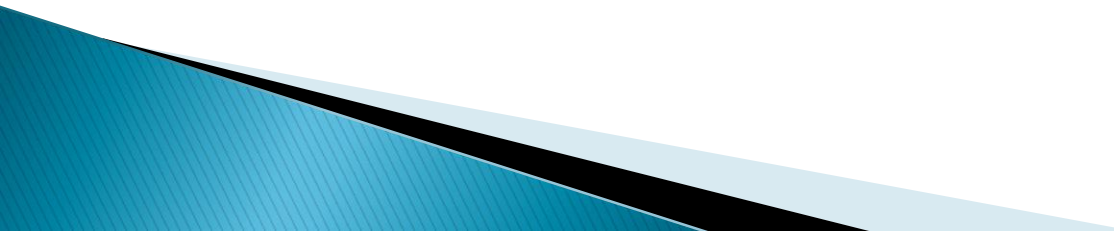

# vi command structure

- ▶ The general form of a vi command is
  - [count] command [movement]
  - Examples
    - 4x delete 4 characters
    - dd delete a line
    - 4dd delete 4 lines
    - dj delete current line and line below
    - d4j delete 5 lines (try 4j without a d)
    - d\$ delete to end of line (try just \$)
    - dw delete word (try just w)
    - D delete to end of line

# Editing a file with vi(vim)

- ▶ Get help
  - Type **:help** followed by RETURN in command mode
- ▶ *vi commands are case sensitive*
- ▶ Undo mistakes
  - Use **u** in command mode to undo the last action
  - Use **U** in command mode to undo the changes for the entire line
- ▶ Redo a command
  - Use **CTRL+R** in command mode
